- Zealous leadership, advocacy and responsibility for consistent implementation of school wide culture and academic goals for teachers and students.

- Collaborate with academic staff (content leads, grade level leads, assistant principal, principal) to support sharing of best practices and cultivate an academic growth and results-oriented culture.
- Collaborate with academic staff on the successful execution, measurement and achievement of instructional goals.
- Analyze instruction and assessment data in order to inform academic decisions, professional development and teacher coaching to meet students' needs and academic goals.
- Prepare for and conduct weekly observations and coaching one-on-ones for most math and science teachers to ensure the implementation of rigorous, engaging, high-impact, college preparatory lessons that accelerate student academic growth and differentiate for the needs of individual students.
- Teach an elective within the science department.
- Lead teachers on data gathering learning walks to promote a culture of continuous improvement.
- Collaborate with academic staff in the planning of professional development to invest in teacher growth and ensure best instruction and assessment practices across all classrooms
- Collaborate with the Director of Academic Resources and Support & School Psychologist on teacher implementation of student intervention systems of support/challenge
- Collaborate in the development of systems to celebrate teacher growth and success
- Lead summer professional development programs for all new and early career teachers.
- Assist in the recruitment, hiring and onboarding of highly effective teachers and staff
- Participate in other roles related to being a part of the school community, including attending campus ministry retreats, supporting work study initiatives, and leading student clubs.
